THE FABULOUS BEEKMAN BOYS OCTOBER 16, 2014



THAT TREE JANUARY 15, 2015



While recovering from a near-fatal car accident, photojournalist Mark Hirsch was encouraged by a friend to capture images of a magnificent bur oak tree standing alone on the horizon near his rural Wisconsin home. The photos, taken daily for one year with his iPhone, became

for Hirsch an unintended adventure in self-discovery and gave him the healing, inspiration and enlightenment he needed. His project has been celebrated on *CBS News Sunday Morning*, NPR Public Radio, and in major newspapers, and is followed by 40,000 devoted fans on his Facebook page, where he continues to share new photos of his favorite bur oak. *That Tree* was published in 2013.

Dr. Temple Grandin

THINKING IN PICTURES FEBRUARY 19, 2015

Named one of *Time Magazine's* 100 most influential people, Temple Grandin's achievements are all the more remarkable because at age two she had no speech and all the signs of severe autism. Her mother enrolled her in early intervention programs; later, mentoring by a high school science teacher and a rancher aunt motivated her to

become a scientist and livestock equipment designer. Dr. Grandin shares how her ability to "think in pictures" helps her solve problems that neuro-typical brains might miss. She makes the case that the world needs people on the autism spectrum: visual, pattern and verbal thinkers, and all kinds of smart, geeky kids. Claire Danes portrayed her in the award-winning HBO film *Temple Grandin*.

DRESS & FASHION IN JANE AUSTEN & HER WORLD MARCH 19, 2015



"Mrs. Powlett was at once expensively & nakedly dress'd; we have had the satisfaction of estimating her Lace & her Muslin; & she said too little to afford us much other amusement." This report, delivered by Jane Austen in an 1801 letter to her sister, is one of the many characteristically pithy assessments that fill her correspondence. Although Austen often portrayed fashion-consciousness in her novels as a sign of frivolous behavior,

privately she was as concerned with cutting a fine figure as everyone else in Regency England. Art historian and Art Institute lecturer Jeffrey Nigro discusses aspects of "dress and undress" in the fashions of Austen's day and how those fashions reflect changing social ideals.

Elizabeth Murray

LIVING LIFE IN FULL BLOOM APRIL 16, 2015



Best known for her photographs of Monet's gardens, taken over a 30 year period, and for being the first woman gardener to help restore them, author and artist Elizabeth Murray presents a guide for living beautifully and creatively. The Four Pathways in her book, *Living Life in Full Bloom*, help us tap into The Gardener (cultivating intimacy with nature), The Artist (expanding creativity and imagination), The Lover (leading with the heart and committing to what

we love), and The Spirit-Weaver (bringing celebration, ceremony, blessings and gratitude into each day). Murray's presentation blends photographic images with personal stories, garden metaphors, and humor to inspire her audience to connect with what has meaning for them and to express their own creativity.
